Our Archive of more than 2,000 articles, essays and commentary is an unsurpassed collection of the best of Adventist progressive thought and research. or more than 50 years *Spectrum* writers, scholars and contributors have made Spectrum's website and journal our church's most influential independent public voice. Our Archive of more than 2,000 articles, essays and commentary is an unsurpassed collection of the best of Adventist progressive thought and research.

Currently, our Archives are divided between the website and the journal, so anyone trying to search for an item needs to already know where it originally

appeared. For instance, was that fascinating article by Kendra Haloviak Valentine in the Journal or on the website? One has to do a double search if your first guess is not correct. And the Archives do not include our various audio and visual materials from conferences and presentations. The Archive Project will fix these challenges by bringing together all the *Spectrum* material in one place for searching. In addition, we would like to create a regular feature on our website that highlights articles from the past that are pertinent to the present—similar to what the *Washington Post* does in its Retropolis section, where, as they say, "The past is rediscovered." We'll need a curator who is familiar with the materials in our library and who will be able to retrieve relevant content at the right time.

In response to requests from readers and researchers, the Archive Project will unlock *Spectrum's* vast collection and assure that our rich past of scholarship and meaningful inquiry continues to contribute to current conversations. Reposting of important and interesting articles from our past will engage new readers as well as remind longtime readers of our distinguished legacy.

nder Bonnie Dwyer's leadership, *Spectrum* has published distinctive independent reporting on activities of SDA entities and representatives around the world and encouraged more transparent communications and accountability by the Church.

As the 2015 General Conference (GC) session in San Antonio, Texas began, the GC planned only to live-stream the devotional meetings and Sabbath services. The presence of *Spectrum* writer Alexander Carpenter at a business session where delegates would vote on issues related to the ordination of women ultimately led to the decision by the GC to livestream business meetings of the Executive Committee at the GC sessions and the annual spring and fall meetings. Carpenter's readiness to livestream the proceedings with his own equipment helped the leadership realize there was room for improving communications with the global membership.

In the following year, *Spectrum* broke a story about inappropriate behavior at the highest level of the South African Division after being approached by local church members to report on the situation. The Executive Committee of the South African Division sided with its church members who had sought action against the President. He was removed from office and given a church to pastor.

To enable first-class content presentation, integration, and access by our global audience for this new decade, we must redesign and upgrade our digital platform. Our current Drupal 7 platform will no longer be supported by the vendor after November 2022.

Furthermore, with the explosion in the volume and formats of content *Spectrum* wishes to share with an international audience, we can greatly improve our interfaces with various technologies to improve the user experience. Equally important to an organization with limited staff and budget, we could incorporate programs that reduce the amount of labor involved with posting content and communications for our various audiences.

#### How \$100,000 Will Grow the Vision:

- \$15,000-32,500 Design Phase creates blueprint for new website's features and aesthetics, the functionality of the sitemap, and additional tools to make the management and use of the website more efficient.
- \$30,000-60,000 Development Phase builds the new website infrastructure according to the blueprint approved. Purchase of a hosting plan and any third-party tools required will be included in this phase.

**Staff.** A small one which does big things—such as editing the Journal, website, social media, newsletters and an array of other internal and external communications. Working closely with the Board and other volunteers, the staff organizes the details of executing the Adventist Forum's strategic plan. The memberships and contributions which make everything possible must also be solicited, legal tax receipts issued, and funds channeled to the intended purposes. The staff Interacts with everyone from officials of Adventist institutions and church members to the general public or media as well as those in the Spectrum community or partner organizations.

**Headquarters.** Our small office space is essential for managing the yearly flow of events, publications, board and committee activities, and official organizational archives and records. We have rent, utility, phone, banking, postage, office supplies and other expenses associated with base camp activities.
